How did your career in the parks & recreation industry begin?

Years back on a family vacation to Yellowstone National Park (we also visited the Badlands, Grand Tetons, and several other destinations out west). Inspired by that experience, I decided that I wanted to pursue a purpose in the field of outdoor recreation. At that time, I didn't exactly have a plan, rather just a general direction. Ultimately, I ended up attending Illinois State University majoring in Parks and Recreation Administration. I volunteered at many agencies during this time, just trying to get a better understanding of the industry and all its offerings. I ultimately ended up performing an internship for a local county Parks and Recreation department, which I was able to parlay into a seasonal, and then full-time position within that organization. Initially my focus was on the recreation side of things, working quest services, creating and leading recreation programming, working sponsorships, and so on. A new challenging opportunity opened within that same organization and I moved to operations and maintenance. I took with me a firm understanding of programming and business, and began to develop an interest in asset management, asset improvement, and natural resource conservation. Weaving all of these aspects together was challenging and extremely appealing. After gaining knowledge and insight, I had realized that I wanted to expand the opportunity for career growth and applied for a position that interested me at the Fox Valley Park District. I interviewed and hired for a position that we informally called "Trees and Trails." It was a position in our operations work group that primarily focused on all aspects of arboriculture, managing our tree and inventory, and maintaining and managing all aspects of our regional and internal trail systems. I was hooked. I subsequently pursued an open position within the organization in Parks grounds maintenance, performing all aspects of maintaining our wonderful park system. After a few years of development, I was able to apply for and earn a position as a grounds maintenance supervisor, continuing to learn and develop under experienced leadership. Years later I was once again considered for a promotion to serve as Assistant Director of Parks.
